GIRLS BUILD LA

- Application is open until September 18th
- Funded Teams will receive a seed funding of \$500 to start their team and can unlock another \$500 for completing set milestones by December.
- An Expo will be held on a Saturday in late April/ early May to highlight team successes. Individual scholarships and team awards will be given



WHAT MAKES A TEAM?

- Members must be students from the same public middle or high school in Los Angeles County
- At least 6 female students or students who identify as female
- Students who have participated in the past are welcome to join again this year



SITE COORDINATOR

- The coordinator is usually an employee at the school or an afterschool program provider
- Will receive a \$1200 stipend
- Primary point person with LA Promise Fund
- Expected to work with the team through the entire school year



COORDINATOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Recruit the girls
- Find time and space to hold meetings
- Coordinate logistics from the school side
- Manage and facilitate spending of the budget
- Guide the team to stick to production timeline to execute project and document the work



QUESTIONS IN THE APPLICATION

- School details / information
- Coordinator contact information
- School Demographics broken down by ethnicity and percentage qualified for free and reduced lunch
- Names of at least 6 participating students - we need to know you have a team in place



QUESTIONS IN THE APPLICATION

- Mission Statement
- Statement of Opportunity
- Project Need
- Anticipated Outcomes (short term and long term)
- 3 minute Intro Video
- Bonus: activities that are already in the works; social media / website links to your school or team



INTRO VIDEO

- No longer than 3 minutes introducing yourself, your students, your school and an overview of your topic.
- Turn in through a YouTube or Google Drive link (instructions inside the application).
- Our tips on how to make an application video
- Sample Video from last year's winner



PROJECT IDEA

Be sure to have a clear idea of the impact area you want to address and why it is important.



- 1. Health & Wellness,
- 2. Civic Engagement & Leadership
- 3. College Access & STEM Education



HOW TO START YOUR PROJECT

Hold an informational meeting to brainstorm ideas!

Some things we've seen work:

- 1. Invite girls to a lunch meeting.
- 2. Encourage them to bring a friend.
- 3. Include snacks.

HOW TO DECIDE ON A PROJECT IDEA

Set Goals:

- What it is that you and your team hope to accomplish?
- Who are the people that you most want to influence?
- Set a vision and then work backwards as you develop a project proposal.





HOW TO DECIDE ON A PROJECT IDEA

Understand the Context:

- Make sure you are exploring the causes that might be responsible for the issue you want to address.
- Unpack why the students are making an assumption about their project.
- Conduct research, surveys to get ideas about how to proceed.

TIMELINE

September 18, 2017 - Application closes. We will fund **50 teams** which includes the Site Coordinator stipend and the **\$500** start up funds.

October 4, 2017 - Invitations are sent to selected teams for the GBLA Challenge.

October 11, 2017 (subject to change) - GBLA Young Women's Leadership Summit.

October - December 2017 - Unlock an additional \$500 seed funding by: submitting your project management plan, budget and link to your website.

January - April 2018 - Project execution and implementation.

April 28, 2018 (subject to change) - Girls Build LA Expo and Celebration on a Saturday for parents and community to join together.


